| PROGRAM OBJECTIVE: |
| The program's objective is to provide focused education that gives its graduates the ability to listen and think critically, and use suitable modes of inquiry and judgment to propose solutions to complex problems. Graduates will learn to practice in accordance with legislation that affects the nursing and health care industry, within a professional and/or ethical nursing framework, and with evidence-based, practical application. Graduates will be able to: plan nursing care in consultation with individuals/groups, significant others and the interdisciplinary health care team provide comprehensive, safe and effective nursing care to achieve identified health outcomes and evaluate progress towards expected health outcomes in consultation with health care team. Our graduates will establish, maintain and appropriately conclude therapeutic relationships, serve in roles designed to meet the needs of a variety of populations in a changing society, and stay current in published research related to efficacy and effectiveness in nursing. Our nursing program is designed to aid our graduates in developing and understanding how to exercise discretion and judgment in the delivery of their services. |

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Program provides education courses in such subjects as communication, social sciences, and natural sciences. The program includes a challenging curriculum, encompassing: Advanced Clinical, Intensive Care, Advanced Health Assessment, Critical Care, Advanced Pathophysiology, Trans-cultural Nursing, Community Health, Advanced Pharmacology, Leadership in Nursing, Research in Nursing and Issues in Nursing. The program is designed for licensed RNs with an Associate Degree in Nursing. The upper division of the nursing coursework is designed to prepare professional nurses to use the latest technology, knowledge, abilities and skills to be affective in the multidisciplinary settings and will prepare nursing leaders for the promotion of quality healthcare in the global healthcare environment.

Academic Probation Policy

Academic Probation occurs when a student is not meeting satisfactory progress. Students on academic probation are required to retake courses they failed or upgrade skills that lowered their GPA/ completion percentage, until they have met the standards of satisfactory progress. A student who is not making satisfactory progress after one quarter term of academic probation may be placed on probation for one additional quarter. If students cannot improve their grades after the second quarter on Academic Probation they will be dismissed from the school. Students may appeal probation or dismissal. This will allow students to explain any mitigating or special circumstances. In order to pursue the appeal process, students must petition the school in writing, outlining the reasons for not being able to maintain satisfactory progress. The petition must also include steps that will be taken by the student to improve his/her academic standings with the school. The letter must be addressed and delivered to the Director of Education. All petitions will be reviewed and responded to in writing.
